From the Pastor.....

My Country 'Tis of Thee

As you probably know this Sunday, July 1st we will celebrate together our Independence as a nation and our freedom we have in Christ. We will do this with patriotic songs, prayers for our leaders, pledges and coming to the Lord's table to remember His sacrifice that bought our freedom from sin and self. I also hope we sing "My Country 'Tis of Thee," one of my personal favorite national hymns. There's a story that accompanies the writing of this moving hymn. It was written by Samuel Francis Smith, a Baptist clergyman and was first sung in his church in Boston, MA. Ever since then it has been sung deep into the hearts of free people everywhere.

Oliver Wendell Holmes, Harvard classmate of Smith, attributes the genius of this great hymn to its very first word, "my," a personal possessive pronoun that instantly strikes a silver chord in every patriot's heart. "MY country 'Tis of Thee, that little pronoun did it all, and will do it," said Holmes, brilliant poet and keenest wit of his generation. "Why couldn't any of the rest of us thought of that? That puts America in the hearts of people, and because of it Sam Smith will live when Longfellow and Whittier and all the rest of us have gone onto oblivion."

Holmes was revealing a great truth. God is like that. There are many people who know Him only in a remote, objective, impersonal sense. They acknowledge Him as Creator, and admit that the world offers abundant proof of a Master Workman. But they have never acquainted themselves with Him so they can say, MY God! We need to follow the example of Thomas in the New Testament. When confronted with the realization that Jesus was the risen Messiah, he was able to say, "MY Lord and MY God."

<u>On a personal note</u>.....I wanted to update all of you on Terri's condition and cancer journey. She finished the initial surgeries, chemotherapy treatments, and radiation treatments at the end of last year. After several months of healing and completing her hormonal infusions last month, she is now scheduled for surgery on July 9th in order to prepare her for reconstruction surgery which will take place in the September/October time frame. As we have said in the past, your prayers and various visible means of encouragement have sustained us through this difficult process. We are very grateful for your continued support and ask for your prayers as we enter this last phase of treatment.

Some of you have asked if Terri and I are taking any vacation time this summer. The answer is yes. We will be gone for one Sunday on August 12th and we will be heading to Chicago's Wrigley Field to catch a 3 game series with the Washington Nationals during that weekend. We had planned this last year and due to Terri's illness and treatments we had to cancel. So, needless to say we are looking forward to seeing our beloved, "World Series Champions" Chicago Cubs!
