Can we not be on mission everywhere? Jesus was! During a recent sermon by Rev. Lithgow, he stated that "we have no idea of the significance of our small acts." Coupled with that, I'm reading a book called "Just Walk Across the Room" that Dr. Sizemore mentioned in a recent sermon. We can each play a role in moving someone closer to Christ—perhaps it's a smile, a kind word, an invitation to church, or telling and showing others about Christ on the softball field on Sunday morning.

Many of our own actions support people NOT attending church on Sunday morning. We go to the grocery store before and after church, buy a newspaper, go out for lunch, even go shopping—all on a Sunday morning. Someone has to skip church on Sunday morning to meet our needs; we have created the demand. So perhaps we should not be too judgmental of those who have chosen to play a sport on Sunday morning and take the opportunity of spreading the gospel at the same time.

We each need to be on mission, using whatever gifts God has given us wherever God has placed us. We each need to pray that God will use us to bring others to Him, even if our methods seem a bit unorthodox to others.
