From the Pastor.....

Each year in accordance with church By-Laws, we nominate, elect and ordain new Deacons. This month the congregation of BGBC has the privilege and responsibility to participate in this important aspect of our church by prayerfully nominating qualified men and women to serve in this position.

The New Testament provides two passages, one from the book of Acts and one from the Apostle Paul's letter to Timothy, that help us understand this important position in the life of the church. In 1 Timothy 3:8-13, we have the clearest text of scripture that describes the qualities of those who receive the role of "special servant" or "Deacon." When you look closely at this passage what you see are men and women who follow Christ closely. These are qualities that rub off on those who walk with Jesus. This is what happens to one who spends time looking at Him, listening to Him, learning from Him, and living like Him! This passage gives emphasis to what a Deacon is to be, not so much what a Deacon is to do. The inference is, if a person is what they ought to be, then they will do what they ought to do.

The passage in Acts 6:1-7, does give us a clearer glimpse as to what Deacons are to do, which is essentially this: be assistants to the Pastor, be servants to the church, and be witnesses to the world!

On Sunday, 30 April, there will be an insert placed in each bulletin where you can make your nominations. Additionally, the forms will be available each Sunday and in the church office through Wednesday, 17 May. Please read carefully the aforementioned biblical passages to ensure the person you are nominating is scripturally qualified. Also ensure he or she is a member of the church and is currently serving or has served in some capacity in the church. Movie nights aren't just for fun. We've had several movie nights this year that have created a lot of interesting conversation on topics ranging from evangelism to Revelation. One of the big focuses we have had this year is ensuring that we never miss an opportunity to share the Word of God to our students in some way, shape, or form and what we have discovered is exactly how hungry these students are for Truth.

In student ministry, we treasure every chance we get to minister to your youth. In terms of weekly time, that amounts to around 2.5 hours per week including Sunday School and Wednesday nights. If you figure that students are in school from 7:30a-2:50p Monday through Friday and might sleep from 10am-6am, **that means formal student ministry gets about 3% of their time during the work week**. We also understand that, when you look at many of the students attending church, some of them get different levels of spiritual support in the home whether that is due to a lack of faith in the household or competing priorities. This is why we try to offer things like camp, PlanetWisdom, movie night, and more. If you have some way you would like to assist with our student ministry to provide more opportunities to engage our youth, please contact Joseph.

Sabrina Farris is going to lead a 'Rent a Youth' fundraiser on April 29th and May 6th to help with the cost of camp. There are two ways you can help. First, if you have work to get done around the household and would be willing to donate to the youth, we can get a few to your home and put them to work! Each student will 'earn' their fundraising individually. If students want to help who are not going to camp, their hours will be distributed to all campers. The second way you can help is donate without having any particular work in mind. You may be asking yourself what makes a random donation a 'fundraiser'. What we will do is find ways for students to help around our church or in our community and dividing those donations to those who work hours at each event. This way we ensure that those who really need/want the benefit of fundraising get the assistance they need and those who would rather pay their entire way have that option as well.

Finally, please always been on the lookout for things you think you may want to do for our youth. This last month we were approached by Brian and Veronica Hamlin who generously offered to cook dinner for our youth one night a month. This wasn't something the youth team discussed or solicited: Brian and Veronica just wanted to get involved, threw a suggestion out there, and we made it happen. 


