

From the Pastor....

Not long after I came to serve as your Pastor in June, 2016, I was introduced to a vision that Sandra Stevens and many others had in improving the multi-media capabilities of the sanctuary. Part of the vision was realized just before I arrived when the church decided to install a sound system that has proven to be far superior than the old one. Now the church has another opportunity to further enhance the A/V capabilities by installing a state-of-the-art video system. Consequently, we began to investigate this possibility and had 3 different individuals visit our church and submit proposals. The last proposal was submitted by Frank Beale, of Bowling Green Electronics. Last Wednesday members of the Trustees, Music and Worship Committee, Finance Committee, Building and Grounds Committee, and staff (Pastor Frank, Sandra, and Doug) met with Frank Beale. The purpose of the meeting was to review and consider his proposal to install a video system in the sanctuary. The project would involve the following:

1. Installing a custom made screen over the choir loft that would be powered so that it could be lowered and raised. When not in use the screen would be hidden from view.
2. Utilizing a projector with a ultra long-throw lens to project images on to the screen from a vantage point in the balcony.
3. Installing a 60 inch flat screen TV below the balcony railing for the choir and people utilizing the platform.
4. Installing all cabling, wiring and electrical components.
5. Purchasing a laptop computer with a multiport adapter and necessary software. (The laptop would also be utilized in both services)

The cost for the proposal that includes all equipment, labor and miscellaneous expenses is approximately \$20,000. Consequently, after meeting with Mr. Beale the aforementioned church leaders have decided to recommend to the congregation that we accept the proposal and begin the project so that it will be completed before the beginning of the Advent and Christmas season. Therefore, a special called business meeting has been called for October 8, 2017 at 10:00am, following the early service to vote on the motion/proposal.

Some may question the affordability or the wisdom in pursuing this project. This has been discussed thoroughly by many church leaders for as long as I've been here and

perhaps even longer. However, I believe now is the time to do this. With that in mind let me provide you the justification for this project that fits into the following categories:

1. Ministry Enhancement: There is no question that this project will improve our worship service by enriching our music and worship capabilities. It will also augment greatly our preaching and teaching by utilizing slides and video. It is very possible that these improvements will not only boost the worship experience of our current members and attendees but also serve to attract others to a church facility that is utilizing 21st century technology.
2. Fairness: It seems to me that there is a fairness or equality issue here. Shouldn't those who attend the second service in the sanctuary also be afforded the same kind of A/V capabilities that we offer those who attend the early service? I think we should.
3. Affordability: Some may question do we have the money to do this. The simple and short answer is, we do. We presently have about 109K in the checking account. We need about 20K a month for our expenses, give or take. Church financial experts will tell you, much like a household budget, you need about 2-3 months of liquid assets in your checking account. That means we need to maintain about 60K in our checking account. This doesn't even take into account the 200K plus we have in other accounts. Additionally, others in the congregation have already given to a designated fund for this project and more have stated that they will also give.
4. Aesthetics: Mr. Beale assured us that the beauty and traditional look of our sanctuary will be maintained with minimal impact. He has done similar projects at Concord BC and Salem BC, and he was able to blend the Audio Visual improvements with the traditional look quite successfully.

The bottom line....we have the money to spend on worthwhile projects and ministries like this. It will help make our church more attractive to those outside the church and boost our worship experience.

On Sunday, October 22, our annual Hermon association will meet @ Mt. Hermon Baptist Church @ 4:00p.m. All church members are invited to attend. Dinner will be provided after a brief business meeting. Our association project will be to fill "blessing bags" to be distributed to each church and given out to the homeless by those members who would like to participate. Our church collected 300+ tissue packets earlier this year as part of this project. Other items include bottled water, jersey gloves, tooth brush and toothpaste, antibacterial sanitizer, raisins, fruit bars, granola bars, tuna packets, and crackers. Please let me know if you are interested in participating in the "give-out to the homeless" phase of this project.

Look for information/signs coming soon for our Thanksgiving collection of food for the needy starting Sunday, November 5. As always, if you have a family in need of food for Thanksgiving, please let Susie Hicks or one of the WMU members know of this need.
