The organization "Family Life" has created this new series as a companion to the "Art of Marriage" series, which we viewed earlier this year. It is designed for parents, stepparents, single parents, and expectant parents, and includes helpful material for raising children of all ages. This year our church participated in a partnership with Family Practice Group (beside Rite Aid Pharmacy) in July by collecting donations of loose leaf notebook paper and backpacks for underserved children in our community. We exceeded their goal for us of 30 backpacks and 300 packs of notebook paper. These supplies, along with those collected by other organizations and churches will be given out on July 31, 2018 in the parking lot near the clinic. They will also have physical screenings, games, and other fun activities for the children from 3:00pm until 6:00pm. This project will be our school mission project this year.

At our WMU meeting in July we discussed the mission trip of Ella Divelbliss to Russia. We hope to hear more from her when she returns. Our WMU bulletin board will show and tell some information about the group Ella journeys with to Russia. The ARCC (American Russian Christian Connection) consists of Christians from other churches who make this trip each year to the Novgorod area of Russia to conduct Bible School for children. She will be working with a program there which introduces them to Christ for the first time. They will be able to enjoy worship and learn about God in a fun and enjoyable atmosphere. This will also allow family members the opportunity to hear of the love of Jesus. Pastor Frank missioned with others a few years ago and tells of the many blessings received. Pastor Anatoly there is always needing other Christians to come and conduct children's camps and witness to those in these small villages. Many of these children, as well as adults, have never heard of Jesus Christ. Please pray for Ella, the group she will travel with, her family here in the U.S. and those she impacts in far away Russia.




Our Nominating Committee is pleased that all Committee Chairpersons are in place. However, there are many committees that could use YOU as part of the team.
