Thank you, church, for participating in our partnership with Caroline Family Practice Community Health Center to collect notebook paper and backpacks for underserved back to school children in our community. We were able to reach our goal of 300 packs of notebook paper and 30 backpacks. These supplies along with items from other participants resulted in 126 children receiving fully packed backpacks to begin their school year.

The annual offering for Va Missions was named for Alma Hunt, a native Virginian who gave much to the cause of the ministry of Christ. This offering provides funding for all Women's Missions and ministries in Va and provides for special outreach projects. Every dollar given goes to support Va ministries. Our goal this year is \$1,000. Please read the brochure in our bulletin which tells about some of the stories and outreach projects out monies provide. Our special emphasis is Sept 17-23.

The Hermon Association mission project will involve all association churches bringing together designated food items for underserved school children in our community to have on weekends and school holidays.

Our church is asked to collect and donate 300 single serving, microwavable pasta meat cups (such as ravioli/spaghetti and meat balls/beefaroni/lasagna). At our annual meeting we will pack these items, along with other breakfast, lunch, snack, and drink items to be sent home from school. We will collect these items Sunday August 26th through October 7. Baskets will be provided in the Family Ministry Center and under the bench in the missions area hallway. Monetary donations may be given to Susie Hicks or Paulette Britt.
