FROM THE PASTOR

Yesterday at the business meeting there were three items of new business completed by the congregation of BGBC. The **first** was a By-Law revision allowing for a change in the number of Deacons that can serve in the Deacon Ministry. The change was made from nine (9) Deacons to twelve (12). As stated previously, the Deacon body and myself came to the realization that the former number of Deacons (9) needed to be changed to (12). With the church growing in numbers and ministries expanding, we felt it was necessary to expand this important ministry in order to better serve the congregation. This motion was passed unanimously.

Secondly, with the passage of the aforementioned By-Law revision the congregation then voted, by secret ballot, on the four remaining eligible Deacon candidates. Those candidates considered were: Jeff Diritto, Jake Phelix, Bonnie Gromovsky and Joseph Stepp. The candidates receiving most of the votes were:

- Jeff Diritto
- Jake Phelix
- Joseph Stepp

A service of ordination and installation is scheduled for <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 18th in the FMC service at 8:45am</u>.

Thirdly, our 2019 budget was presented, discussed and passed unanimously. More on that later.

Faith and Finances

Our Finance Committee and other church leaders brought to the congregation the 2019 budget which represents an increase of 8 per cent. Most of this increase is a result of expanding our Children's Ministry (CM) by hiring a part-time CM Director. This is a challenge for us, but one that can be met if we remember this simple fact; our focus is on the call of Christ to be faithful in reaching people for Christ and making disciples. That call cannot be accomplished without healthy financing. The main reason for giving is not to maintain the church as an institution but to meet the need of the giver to share what God has given in order to grow in faith and thereby help our commitment to Jesus Christ.

There are two important components to building a church budget. First, the church budget must be based on solid analysis. In order to be wise stewards we must analyze past giving and spending patterns. Knowing the financial history of the church helps to set a reasonable budget for the next fiscal year. Secondly, we must never forget that there is a faith aspect to every budget. The church should expect God's blessing and growth so that it will able to charge ahead with new programs and spending in order to achieve its vision. These two components should not be in competition with each other but a reasonable balance should be found so that the church is free to accomplish God's purposes.
